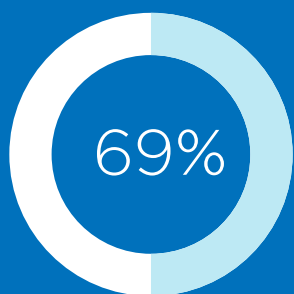

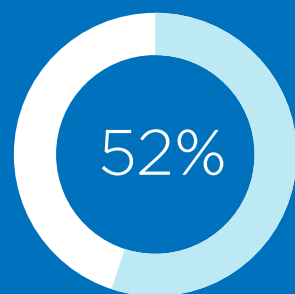

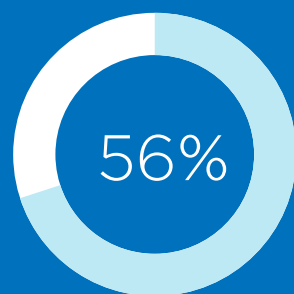

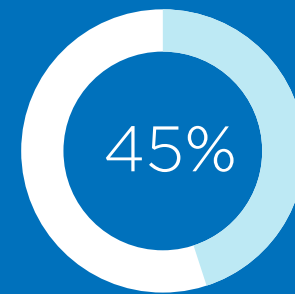
of total net growth in U.S. homeownership in 2015 is attributed to Hispanics



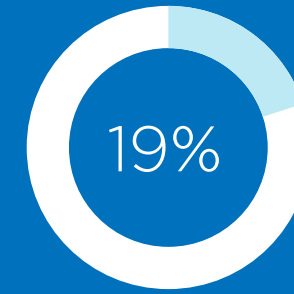
of new homeowners between 2010 and 2030 are projected to be Hispanic



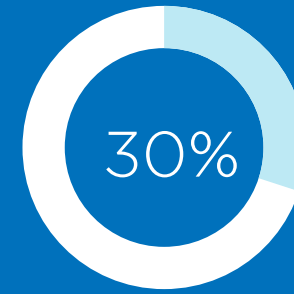
of new household formations in the past 5 years are attributed to Hispanics
